## **GRANTS**

\$37,800.00 - Office for Victims of Crime, Office of Justice Programs, United States Department of Justice. National Conference Support for EAW International's Conference on Sexual Assault, Domestic Violence, and Stalking, March 31-April 2, 2008 in New Orleans, LA.

\$70,000.00 – William H. Donner Foundation, Downstream Orientation in Criminal Justice Response to Sexual Assault, awarded February 2007. With previous grant funding from the foundation, data has been submitted by the MAD communities on a total of 12,164 sexual assault cases, with the following

breakdown: law enforcement (2,951 cases), forensic examiners (2,373 cases), prosecution (2,103 cases), and victim advocacy (4,737 cases). This will conclude the initial phase of data collection. The current grant award will allow us to begin cleaning, compiling and analyzing the data, including matching cases across professional disciplines on the basis of the police report number recorded by law enforcement professionals, forensic examiners, prosecutors, and system-based victim advocates. Preliminary findings will also be presented at one conference and summarized in one article that will be submitted for publication.

The Foundation provided a grant to EVAW International to market the On Line Training Institute with OVW funding and seek continuing education units for law enforcement in as many states as possible.

\$141,000.00 – William H. Donner Foundation, Challenging the Legal Process to Effectively Prosecute Sex Offenders, awarded February 2006. The current grant award will allow us to coordinate communication between participant communities and provide ongoing evaluation research for all 8 communities throughout phase three of the project. It also allows us to provide on site technical assistance for 3 of the remaining 8 communities during 2006, as well as ongoing communication and evaluation research for all 8 communities throughout the third year of the project.

The Max and Victoria Dreyfus Foundation - June 30, 2005

The foundation supports non-profit organizations, specifically in the areas of health, community development and rape crisis centers. EVAW's funding award recognized and supported education and training to improve the community response to violence against women and provided increased capacity to provide services in those areas.

The Harry and Jeanette Weinberg Foundation - June 23, 2005

A one-time only grant to support increased awareness, provide leadership and improve response to sexual assault and domestic violence. Twelve scholarships were provided for advocates working in community based organizations in Baltimore to attend the EVAW International Conference on Sexual Assault, Domestic Violence and Stalking in October 2005.

Horizons Foundation - June 16, 2005

The Horizons Foundation funding contributes toward meeting the stated goals and objectives of EVAW international, both by helping to build our capacity and allowing us to continue to respond to the numerous requests for information and technical assistance that we receive every day. This funding supplements the operating budget and provides discretionary operational spending not specifically allowed under other project grants.

\$127,000.00 – William H. Donner Foundation, Challenging the Legal Process to Effectively Prosecute Sex Offenders, awarded February 2005. The current grant award will allow us to coordinate communication between participant communities and provide ongoing evaluation research for all 8 communities throughout phase two of the project. It also allows us to provide on site technical assistance for 4 of the 8 communities during 2005. In 2006, EVAW International will submit another grant proposal for phase three to provide technical assistance for the remaining 4 communities, as well as ongoing communication and evaluation research for all 8 communities throughout the third year of the project.

\$400,000.00 – Office on Violence Against Women, Targeted Technical Assistance, awarded October 2004. During a two-year period, EVAW International will host 3 regional conferences primarily in rural areas on the topic of state-of-the-art initiatives in criminal justice response to sexual assault and develop an on-line training institute to provide a forum for continued learning, opportunities to practice developing skills, and a certification process to document successful performance.

\$73,631.87 – October 2004, the William H. Donner Foundation awarded EAW International, in partnership with the Institute for Public Health at San Diego State University, a grant to evaluate training outcomes using a variety of indicators, such as the knowledge and skills demonstrated in the on-line training program and a repeated assessment of community collaboration as a result of the regional training programs and the on-line training institute. Specifically, all training participants will complete a detailed survey of community collaboration before attending one of the regional training conferences, after attending one of the regional training conferences, and then again after completing the on-line training institute and certification process.

\$165,719.00 - William H. Donner Foundation, Challenging the Legal Process to Effectively Prosecute Sex Offenders, awarded October 1, 2003. EAW International was awarded the grant to sponsor a national conference to promote integrated community responses to sexual violence. Conference scholarships were awarded to joint applicant teams of eight representatives from the police, prosecution, rape crisis centers and other sexual assault service providers, within the same community. The core vision of the conference, October 26-29, 2004, is to challenge the legal process to effectively prosecute sex offenders by redefining the way sexual assaults are conceptualized by the criminal justice system. The goal of the conference is intervention – to effect social change and make a difference in public policy.

\$130,000.00 - COPS School-Based Partnership Grant, (#1999SBWX0086) awarded in August 1999. The **Sexual Assault Risk Reduction Curriculum** was a collaborative project funded by a grant from the Office of Community Oriented Policing Services (COPS).
